

For more than 30 years, the members of Kitchen Kapers have raised over \$1 million to support cancer care at OhioHealth Riverside Methodist Hospital.

Kitchen Kapers is a group of dedicated and hardworking volunteers who affect great change in the lives of patients through their fundraising efforts. Proceeds from the annual tour provide philanthropic support to the Integrated Cancer Care Program, a holistic program aimed at treating more

than a patient's cancer. This area of medicine draws on the fields of nutrition, stress management, physical fitness, massage therapy, acupuncture and many other non-traditional therapies.

This year, their philanthropic efforts also enabled patients to participate in our Cold Cap Therapy program. Cold Cap Therapy is a cooling system that constricts blood vessels in the scalp, which may allow patients to keep more of their hair during treatment by reducing the amount of chemotherapy medicine reaching hair follicles. Kitchen Kapers' support is helping patients participate in the program for less than half the cost!

Kitchen Kapers members have not only worked tirelessly to prepare an outstanding tour, they have also shared their time at Riverside Methodist, preparing over 600 art kits for the Art Therapy Program and volunteering with the "high tea" service on Seven Yellow (Oncology). Once a week, patients, family and friends are treated to a "high tea" service, complete with music, tea and pastries. Each patient is also given a single rose.

By working in the hospital and around the patients for whom they seek to help, Kitchen Kapers members are able to see firsthand the impact of their efforts. And we at OhioHealth are beyond grateful for their devotion to the patients and families we serve.

Mark is an award winning journalist who has covered deadly tornadoes in Oklahoma, devastating floods in Colorado and destructive wildfires in Oregon. He is also a nationally published writer and Huffington Post contributor.

Most recently, Mark was the weekend anchor at the CBS affiliate in Denver, Colorado where he covered the aftermath and sentencing of the Aurora theater

shooter's trial. He was also on the front lines of Colorado's devastating flood in 2013 that caused millions of dollars in damage and left several dead.

Before Denver, Mark was the weekend anchor at the Fox affiliate in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma where he was one of the first reporters on the scene after the 2013 Moore Tornado which killed more than two dozen people and caused two billion dollars in damage. His investigative reporting in the aftermath revealed mistakes made by the OKC animal shelter and the accidental euthanization of a family dog, which led to new changes in procedure.

Mark has also been a reporter and anchor in Phoenix Arizona and Eugene, Oregon. He graduated from The Walter Cronkite School of Journalism at Arizona State University with a degree in Mass Communications and Journalism.

Mark was born in Phoenix, Arizona but both his parents are from Toronto, Canada. In his free time you can catch him at Starbucks, the gym, or hanging out with his pug Paige.

Greg and Lisa completed renovations on the home before moving in on March 1, 2014. The home had seen improvements before with the Spielman Family adding on and renovating in the late 1990's, but Greg and Lisa wanted to update and modernize things. The kitchen features two islands, one of which offers ample seating for guests. Granite countertops surround the kitchen except for on the center island where butcher block can be found. The two copper farmhouse sinks will also catch your eye. Storage is no issue with a multitude of cabinetry, as well as a large pantry just off the kitchen that is shielded by two gorgeous wood and glass doors.

Greg and Lisa enlisted the help of their designer, architect and general

contractor in 2018 when they set out to increase use of the outdoors by transforming their front patio, adding an outdoor summer kitchen, as well as completing a pool project. Lisa and Greg love to cook outdoors whenever possible. They are a family with four children, three of whom have a summertime birthday, so the warmer months present many opportunities to entertain.

Torres Home

2400 ONANDAGA DRIVE

Welcome to 2400 Onandaga Drive, the home of Adam and Jessica Torres. Prepare to enjoy an abundance of natural light while touring this home. The sun illuminates nearly every square inch thanks to countless windows, including some that are floor to ceiling.

The Torres family purchased the home in 2016 and have remodeled it extensively both inside and out. They spent close to two years working on the property, which was originally built in 1942. The footprint of the home changed some during renovations, with Adam and Jessica getting creative with what they had to work with. With the help of their architect, they were able to steal square footage from the second floor of the house to create double-height ceilings in a portion of the first floor. For the kitchen, they focused on creating a place where everyone could congregate during parties and gatherings but not feel disjointed from the rest of the main living space. Jessica shares that the new kitchen is essentially a larger version of the kitchen they had in their previous home.

Quartz countertops with distinctive veining and an arabesque style backsplash tile work together with the white cabinetry and brushed chrome hardware to create an aesthetic feel. European Oak hardwood floors in a natural finish gleam underneath all the

home's light. The ocean blue accent color on the bookshelves in the nearby family room add color, while the black windows and door frames add contrast. Jessica shares that one of her favorite kitchen features is her "appliance garage," which houses the coffee maker, espresso machine, toaster and other gadgets. The cabinet front raises and lowers on custom hinges for easy access and keeps the counters free of clutter.

Cooking and entertaining are also an outdoor activity for the Torres family. Their outdoor space features a kitchen with built-in grill and overhead vent as well as a sink. They also have an inground spa which doubles as a plunge pool in the warmer months.

Cancer hits close to home for the Torres Family. Adam's father has battled kidney cancer. Jessica's best friend is a three-time melanoma survivor. We extend our sincere gratitude to the Torres family for joining us in support of cancer care by opening their stunning home for tour day.



A light and airy atmosphere awaits you behind the front door of 2288 Coventry Road. This is the feel John and Whitney Lee wanted to create when they began renovating the house they purchased in 2014. They moved out of the home when work began and returned eight months later to a space that had been revitalized.

But one element of the past remains in their new kitchen as a reminder of the history that the home holds. The original map/lot plan can be found hanging at the foot of the stairs, which the Lees found in the basement upon moving in. The previous owner, Mary Ross, kept the plans from when she built the home with her husband in 1946. The home was a part of the original King Thompson development in South Upper Arlington.

Those plans are all that remain of the old dwelling thanks to architect Tom Beery and general contractor Derrick Layer Custom Homes. The Lees were looking for the home to feel livable, with every single room being used. They veered away from wasted spaces and anything that felt formal. Therefore, the

home does not house a formal dining room. They wanted the home to feel less choppy and aimed to add some southern touches in the style of Joanna Gaines. Whitney did all the design and décor on her own, as it is something that she really enjoys.

The kitchen features quartz countertops, white cabinets with oil-rubbed bronze hardware and accents of black and gray tones. Special features complete this kitchen including a rollout in the bar area, so guests have easy access to drink selections. Don't miss the pantry door, which Whitney worked with her general contractor to have custom made after seeing something similar on Pinterest. She enjoys using it to make grocery lists, share fun sayings, etc.



Next the Lees will move on to the outdoor space of their home. They have big plans for an outdoor kitchen and a lounge area. In the meantime, they mainly entertain inside and share that low-key hangouts are their favorite – usually with pizza, family and friends hanging out around the island.

Whitney lost her grandmother, with who she was extremely close, to cancer. We can't thank the Lee family enough for supporting our cause, which provides care to so many fighting the disease.

The finished product took about three months to complete and incorporates the white finishes favored by the Rigos, complimented by splashes of gold and black. Be sure to take in all the thoughtfully planned touches in these hues while touring this home.

Most striking of these features is the variety of artistic backsplash tile used throughout the kitchen. Three different types were used, which means with each turn you are greeted by another stunning tile. The hardware that completes the white inset cabinetry adds a touch of gold, as do the regal light fixtures through the kitchen. These are worth an extra look, especially the one that was placed just above the window by the sink.

All these tasteful details are tied together by quartz and marble countertops as well as by the gorgeous oak floors you will find under foot. No newly remodeled kitchen is complete without a special feature that is loved by the cook who uses it the most. For Kori, that feature is the knife drawer. She loves that she no longer needs to store knives on the counter.

The Rigo family loves to cook anything and everything. They also enjoy entertaining others. They often host large groups, which prompted them to also upgrade a powder room, an upstairs bathroom and their patio area.

The OhioHealth Survivorship Clinic



For over 38 years, I was a practicing surgeon treating cancer in Central Ohio. I found this work very challenging, yet satisfying. As I neared the end of my clinical practice, I recognized that while many of the patients were cured of their cancer, some continued to deal with the effects of their diagnosis and treatment. This sparked my interest into the relatively new discipline of Survivorship.

A survivor is generally thought of as anyone who has ever been diagnosed with cancer. Some patients who have had cancer prefer to think of it in the past and move forward, returning to their "normal" life. Others may feel that they are still living with cancer and do not feel like survivors.



Individuals who have a history of cancer have very different experiences and feelings.
However, most are living different lives than before their diagnosis.
Some live with a fear of recurrence or development of a different cancer. Others feel empowered after conquering a great challenge and live life more fully with more meaning and different priorities.

Through my practice, I recognized that treating cancer was just the first step. The next steps were dealing with the treatment effects, which may include surgery, chemotherapy, radiation therapy and anti-hormone therapy. While some patients may have minimal symptoms, others may be debilitated by fatigue, pain, numbness, arm swelling, hot flashes, change in appearance, or the stress of worrying about recurrence and maintaining employment.

The number of cancer survivors is growing at a great rate. In 1971, there were about 3 million survivors in the United States. There was over a five-fold increase by 2016, with about 15.5 million. By 2026, that number will be 20.3 million! Fortunately, this number is increasing because of better diagnosis and improved treatment regimens.

This also means that significantly more people are dealing with treatment effects. Survivorship programs are designed to support cancer patients after their active treatment has ended. The program reviews and provides the patient with their treatment plan, which includes their physicians, surgeries, chemotherapy names and dosing and radiation details. It also highlights guidelines for surveillance of new or recurrent cancers. In addition, a comprehensive listing of possible complications or side effects alert the patient of when to report something to their health care team.



At the OhioHealth Survivorship Clinic, concerns are eased and appropriate referrals are made to genetics, dietician, physical therapy, psychosocial counseling, and integrative therapies. Upon accepting the position of Medical Director of Cancer Survivorship this past April, I am excited for the opportunity to provide these

types of services to patients who have had to deal with cancer. I believe this role will be very fulfilling, as my goal is to provide encouragement and hope to help our patients become empowered and thriving survivors.
